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Seed Stitch On an Even Number of Stitches: Row 1: *K1, p1; rep from * to end of row. Row 2: *P1, k1; rep from * to end of row. Repeat Rows 1 and 2.	Seed Stitch On an Odd Number of Stitches: Row 1: *K1, p1; rep from * to end of row. Work all rows alike.
Seed Stitch in the Round on an Even Number of Stitches: Round 1: *K1, p1; rep from * to end of round. Round 2: *P1, k1; rep from * to end of round. Repeat Rounds 1 & 2.	Seed Stitch in the Round on an Odd Number of Stitches: Round 1: *K1, p1; rep from * to last st, k1. Round 2: *P1, k1; rep from * to last st, p1. Repeat Rounds 1 & 2.
Snake Cable Patt (Worked flat, over 8 sts) Rows 1 (RS): P2 k4 p2. Row 2 and all WS rows: K2 p4 k2. Row 3: P2 C4B p2. Rows 5, 7: P2 k4 p2. Row 9: P2 C4F p2. Row 11: P2 k4 p2.	Snake Cable Patt (Worked in the round, over 8 sts) Rounds 1-5: P2 k4 p2. Round 6: P2 C4B p2. Rounds 7-11: P2 k4 p2. Round 12: P2 C4F p2.
C4B: Slip 2 sts to cable needle, hold in back, k2, then k2 from cable needle.	C4F: Slip 2 sts to cable needle, hold in front, k2, then k2 from cable needle.
KFB: knit into the front and back of the stitch	

YARN REQUIREMENTS FOR FULL SET:

Young Touch (50gm balls): 6 mos = 4, 12 mos = 5, 18 mos = 6

South Pacific (100gm skeins): 6 mos = 2, 12 mos = 3, 18 mos = 3

SWEATER

Sizes: 6 mos (12 mos, 18 mos)

Finished measurements: Chest: 20 (22, 24) inches

Length: 10 (11, 12) inches

Sleeve length: 7.5 (8.75, 10.25) inches

Materials: 3 (4, 5) 50gm balls Estelle Young Touch Cotton or 2 (2, 3) 100g skeins Estelle South Pacific Cotton.

Needles: 4mm needles OR SIZE NEEDED TO OBTAIN GAUGE

Notions: cable needle, stitch holders, stitch markers, 2 half inch buttons

Gauge: 22 sts and 32 rows in Seed Stitch on 4mm needles = 4 inches/10cm

Back: Cast on 58 (62, 68) sts. Work 5 rows in Seed St.**Next row (RS):** Work 14 (15, 17) sts in Seed St as established, work row 1 of Snake Cable patt on 8 sts, work 14 (16, 18) sts in Seed St as established, work row 1 of Snake Cable patt on 8 sts, work Seed St to end.**Following row (RS):** Work 14 (15, 17) sts in Seed St as established, work row 2 of Snake Cable patt on 8 sts, work 14 (16, 18) sts in Seed St as established, work row 2 of Snake Cable patt on 8 sts, work Seed St to end.

Work as established until piece measures 5.5 (6.25, 7)" from cast on edge.

Cast off 5 sts at beg next two rows. 48 (52, 58) sts rem. Cont even in patt as established until piece measures 10 (11, 12)" from cast-on edge. Cast off.

Front: Work as for back until armhole shaping is complete. Work another inch even in patt as established, ending with a WS row.**Next row (RS):** Work 26 (28, 31) sts in patt. Put rem 22 (24, 26) sts on a holder for right side of neck.

Working only on these sts for the left side of neck, cont in patt until piece meas 1" from division, ending with a WS row.

Work a Buttonhole row (RS): Work to last 3 sts in patt, yo k2tog, work last st in patt.

Cont in patt, working another Buttonhole row an inch from the previous one.

Cont even in patt until piece measures 2.75 (2.75, 3)" from armhole shaping, ending with a RS row.

Next row (WS): Work 4 sts in patt then slip them to a holder, cast off 5 (5, 5) sts, work in patt to end.

Cont on these 17 (19, 21) sts, dec 1 st at the start of every following WS row 6 (7, 7) times. 11 (12, 14) sts rem. If necessary, work even until front measures same length as back. Cast off in patt.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn & pick up 4 sts along the wrong side of the base of the left neck placket, then work across the 22 (24, 26) sts of the right front from the holder. Work even in patt, working the 4 picked up sts in Seed St, until piece measures 2.75 (2.75, 3)" from armhole shaping, ending with a WS row.**Next row (RS):** Work 4 sts in patt, then slip them to a holder, cast off 5 (5, 5) sts, work in patt to end.

Cont on these 17 (19, 21) sts, dec 1 st at the start of every foll RS row 6 (7, 7) times. 11 (12, 14) sts rem. If necessary, work even until front measures same length as back. Cast off in patt.

Collar: Sew both shoulder seams.**With RS facing, rejoin yarn, & work the 4 sts from the right front holder in Seed St patt as established. Pick up 5 (5, 5) along cast off at right front neckline, 8 (9, 10) sts along right front neck slope, 26 (28, 28) sts along back neck, 8 (9, 10) down left front neck slope, 5 (5, 5) along cast off at left front neckline, & work across 4 sts from left front holder. 60 (64, 66) sts total. Place markers 17 (18, 19) sts in from either end.**

Work 3 rows in Seed St. Note: If you need to, increase a stitch so that the Seed St patt continues unbroken across the plackets, & move the markers to accommodate as necessary.

Increase row (RS): *Work in patt to st before marker in patt, kfb, slip marker, kfb; rep from * once more, work in patt to end.

Work an even row, working increased sts into patt. Repeat the above two rows twice more.

Work even in patt until collar meas 2" from pick up. Cast off in patt.

Sleeves: With RS facing, rejoin yarn & pick up 50 (52, 56) sts along full length of armhole edge – both the front and back.**Row 1 (WS):** Work 21 (22, 24) sts in Seed St, k2 p4 k2, work to end in Seed St.**Row 2 (RS):** Work 21 (22, 24) in Seed St as established, work Row 1 of Snake Cable Pattern, work to end in Seed St.

Work 5 (5, 7) more rows in patt.

Dec row (RS): K2tog, cont in patt to last 2 sts, k2tog. Work 7 (7, 9) rows even.

Cont as established, working a dec row every 8 (8, 8) rows 5 (7, 8) more times, to 38 (36, 38) sts.

Smallest size only: cont in pattern, work a dec row followed by 5 even rows, & work 1 more dec row. 34 sts.

All Sizes: Work even as necessary until sleeve measures 7 (8.25, 9.75)". Work 5 rows Seed St. Cast off in patt. Finishing: Sew side & sleeve seams. Sew buttons on right front to match buttonholes. Weave in all ends.
