



FREE PATTERN





## Rolled-brim hat in Estelle Alcazar - Designed by Kate Atherley for Estelle Yarns

**Difficulty Level:** Easy

**Sizes & Finished measurements:**

Size: Child, Teen/Adult S, Adult M, Adult L

Circumference: 18 (20, 22, 24) inches.

Depth: 8.25 (8.75, 9, 9.5) inches

**Materials:**

1 (1, 2, 2) balls Estelle Yarns "Alcazar", 1 5mm 16 inch circular needle, 1 6mm 16 inch circular needle, 1 set 6mm DPNs or long circular for magic loop method, for closure, Stitch markers

**Gauge:**

14 sts and 21 rounds = 4 inches square in stockinette stitch using larger needles

**Method:**

Using smaller circular needle, cast on 66 (72, 78, 84) sts. Join for working in the round, placing a marker for start of round.

Knit all rounds until piece measures 2 inches - unroll edge to measure.

Change to larger circular needle. Knit all rounds until piece measures 4.5 (4.75, 4.75, 4.75) inches from lower edge – DON'T unroll edge to measure this time.

Decrease for Crown:

Note: As you work the decreases, the hat will get too small to work comfortably on the circular needle. At this point, change to DPNs, or the long circular for magic loop method.

Round 1: [K9 (10, 11, 12) k2tog, place marker] 6 times around. 60 (66, 72, 78) sts.

*Note: ensure you're using a distinct marker for the start of the round so you don't lose track.*

Round 2: Knit.

Round 3: [K to 2 sts before marker, k2tog] 6 times around.

Round 4: Knit.

Repeat the last 2 rounds until 12 sts rem, ending with a Decrease round.

Cut yarn, leaving a 6 inch tail and pull through rem sts to close.

**Finishing:** Wash and weave in ends.

## Easy Ridge Scarf - Designed by Kate Atherley for Estelle Yarns

**Materials:** 2 or 3 100 gram balls of Estelle Yarns "Alcazar" – see below for info on finished size and yarn requirements, 1 pair 8mm straight or short circular needles  
1 9-12mm needle (for casting off)

**Difficulty Level:** Easy

**Sizes & Finished measurements:** One size – 6 inches wide. Two balls of yarn gives a scarf approximately 50 inches long, three balls gives a scarf approx 75 inches long.

**Gauge:** Approx 12 sts and 15 rows = 4 inches square in pattern stitch using 8mm needles – gauge isn't critical for this project

**Method:** Cast on 18 stitches. Row 1: Knit. Row 2: Purl. Row 3: Knit. Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: Knit. Repeat the 5 rows of the pattern until you're nearly out of yarn, ending after Row 5. Using larger needle in your right hand to keep edge loose, cast off.

Wash and weave in ends.

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
