

FREE PATTERN



Estelle Gladstone Chunky Accordion Cowl Designed by Kate Atherley

Difficulty Level: Intermediate – uses short-rows.

Sizes & Finished measurements: One size fits most,
Circumference: 20 inches, Depth, long side: 16 inches

Materials:

1 ball Estelle Yarns “Gladstone Chunky” (50% virgin merino wool, 50% acrylic; 160m/100gm ball),
1-16 inch 6.5mm circular needle, 1-8mm needle for casting off, stitch marker

Gauge: Approximately 13 sts and 20 rounds = 4 inches square in stocking stitch after washing.

Note: The project uses almost the entire ball of yarn. Gauge is not critical for this project, but if you don't match gauge you might need a second ball of yarn.

Stitch Glossary:

Wrap and turn, knit side: slip next st to right needle, as if to purl; move the yarn to the front, slip the st back to the left needle; turn so that purl side is facing, bring the yarn to the front in position to purl.

Wrap and turn, purl side: slip next st to right needle, as if to purl; move the yarn to the back, slip the st back to the left needle; turn so that knit side is facing, move the yarn to the back in position to knit.

Working wrapped sts together with the wrap: insert the tip of the right needle from below into the wrap, and then into the stitch it wraps; knit the wrap and the stitch together.

Method: Cast on 65 sts, using a stretchy method like the Long Tail.

Place marker and join for working in the round, being careful not to twist.

Knit 5 rounds, purl 5 rounds, knit 5 rounds, purl 5 rounds. 4 ridges made.

Short row ridge: Knit 1 round.

*Short row 1 (RS): K25, wrap and turn. Short row 2 (WS): P50,
wrap and turn.

Knit to end of round. Knit 1 full round, working wrapped sts together with their wraps.

Repeat from * 3 more times. Purl 5 rounds.

Work a Short-row ridge followed by 5 purl rounds twice more.

Knit 5 rounds; purl 5 rounds; knit 5 rounds.

Cast off, using the larger needle in your right hand to work the stitches, to ensure the edge remains loose.

Finishing: Wash and weave in ends.
