# Hudson Cowl

Designed by Helen Firing

**Difficulty Level:** Easy – knitters need to know how to knit in the round

**Sizes & Finished Measurements:** One size. May be worn as a single or double-wrapped infinity scarf, or even stretched over the shoulders as a capelet. Approximately 9" wide by 34" long, un-stretched  
Note: the purl sections of this cowl are worked double-stranded to add some extra texture and coziness. Ask your yarn shop to wind each hank on their ball winder into a centre-pull ball so that you can knit from each end of the ball at once when working the double-stranded sections. Otherwise, work with both balls at the same time.

**Materials:** 2 (100g/70m) Estelle Yarns "Hudson" (shown in col 366)  
1 marker to indicate beginning of round

**Needles:** One 24" 15mm (US 19) needle

**Gauge:** 6 sts x 10 rows = 4 ins/10 cm in pattern

## Method:

Holding both strands together, cast on 45 sts loosely.

Place marker and join for work in the round, being careful not to twist.

Purl 2 rounds.

\* Bring both strands to back of work and drop the one strand from the outside of ball. Using the single strand from the inside of the ball, knit 2 rounds.

Pick up second strand and bring both strands to the front of work.

Using both strands, purl 2 rounds.\*

Rep from \* to \* 5 times more.

Using both strands, cast off loosely in knit.

## Finishing:

Weave in ends.
