

FREE PATTERN



## **Sakura Triangle Shawl in Estelle Sakura** **Designed by Kate Atherley for Estelle Yarns**

**Difficulty Level** - Easy

**Finished measurements:** Approximately 52 inches wide and 26 inches deep at its deepest point, after blocking

**Materials:**

2 skeins (about 200 grams) Estelle Yarns “Sakura”

1 pair 5.5mm straight or circular needles - 1 6.5mm needle - A stitch marker

**Glossary:**

KFB: Knit into the front of the stitch as normal, pulling the yarn through, but leave the stitch on the left-hand needle. Put the point of the right-hand needle into the back loop of the stitch, and knit that. Pull the yarn through and slip the stitch off the left needle. 2 sts where there used to be one.

**Gauge:**

Approximately 12 sts and 20 rows = 4 inches square in pattern stitch, after blocking; gauge is not critical for this project

**Method:**

**With 5.5mm needle, cast on 9 sts.**

Row 1 (RS): Kfb, k2, kfb twice, k2, kfb, k1. 13 sts.

Row 2 (WS): Knit.

Row 3 (RS): Kfb, k4, kfb twice, k4, kfb, k1. 17 sts.

Row 4 (WS): Knit.

Row 5 (RS): Kfb, k6, kfb twice, k6, kfb, k1. 21 sts.

Row 6 (WS): K11, place marker on the right-hand needle, k10.

**Body**

Row 1 (RS): K3, kfb, k to 1 st before centre marker, kfb, slip marker, kfb, k until 5 sts rem, kfb, k4.

Row 2 (WS): K4, p to last 4 sts, k4.

Repeat rows 1 & 2 twice more, and row 1 again.

Row 8 (WS): K all sts.

Repeat the above 8 rows until you're almost out of yarn, ending after a Row 8.

**Lower Edge**

Knit 5 rows. Using the 6.5mm needle in your right hand, cast off.

**Finishing:**

Wash and weave in ends. To make the shawl look its best, I recommend stretching it out and pinning the three corners, and leaving it to dry.
